NEXT TO THE CLAYPITS WAS A FIELD WITH A PUBLIC FOOTPATH ACROSS TO "POSTLING WENTS" OPPOSITE TO THE DRUM INN. ON THE RIGHT HAND SIDE COMING DOWN

(MOUNT PLEASANT) THROUGH THE VILLAGE WAS "GOLDING'S DAIRY FARM AND FARM HOUSE" THEN WE COME TO BANKSIDE WHERE "EVELYN DOWN" CHURCH ORCHARD LIVED. NEXT WE COME TO THE DRUM INN. THE LANDLORD AT THAT TIME WAS M<sup>r</sup> W. PERCIVAL WITH HIS WIFE AND FAMILY, WHERE THE TOP CARPARK NOW IS USE TO BE A CYCLE REPAIR SHOP, ETC. RUN BY MR PERCIVAL. NEXT TO THE SHOP WAS A <sup>PUBLIC</sup> FOOTPATH LEADING ACROSS TO HAYTON. THEN WE COME TO TWO TERRACE HOUSES THE FIRST ONE NEAREST THE DRUM LIVED M<sup>s</sup> GATES, A KEEN GARDENER. THE SECOND WAS THE LOCAL SHOP OWNED BY MISS HILLS AND HER COMPANION MISS BOWLES

THE SHOP WAS A GENERAL STORES SELLING ALMOST ANYTHING FROM PINS TO PARAFFIN ETC. THEN WE COME TO "TOLSFORD VIEW" ON THE SIGHT OF THE OLD FORGE, MR HARRIS AND HIS SON HARVEST LIVED THERE. MR HARRIS WAS A KEEN MEMBER OF STANFORD CHURCH CHOIR.

NEXT TO THE OLD FORGE WAS "STANFORD LODGE" LATER RENAMED COLLINGWOOD BY ITS THEN OWNER, THE PREVIOUS OWNER BEING M<sup>s</sup> GROTH. THEN TWO 5MI DETACH FARM COTTAGES, "YEN TREE" WHERE LIVED M<sup>r</sup> M<sup>s</sup> W. OXENDEN, NEXT DOOR M<sup>r</sup> M<sup>s</sup> PHILPOT. OPPOSITE YEN TREE COTTAGES WAS MR GODDINGS FARM BUILDINGS STABLES, AND BARN. NEXT TO THEM WAS THE DISTRICT NURSE "MISS TWOSE'S" GARAGE.

AND TWO COTTAGES "ROSEMARY" WHERE MR M<sup>s</sup> GOLDING, JUNIOR LIVED, AND <sup>WOODBINE</sup> HONEY SUET M<sup>r</sup> M<sup>s</sup> HOBDAE & FAMILY.

OPPOSITE SIDE OF THE ROAD WAS "MANOR COTTAGE" WHERE ~~WAS~~ <sup>RETIRED</sup> SCHOOL TEACHER M<sup>s</sup> POPPLEWELL AND DAUGHTERS LIVED.

THERE WAS A DRIVEWAY PAST MANOR COTTAGE LEADING TO "BROOK COTTAGE" HOME OF M<sup>r</sup> M<sup>s</sup> PATTERSON & FAMILY.

~~THEY~~ ON THE ROADSIDE "BROOK PLACE" AT THAT TIME WAS TWO COTTAGES NOW CONVERTED BACK TO ONE HOUSE ~~THEY~~ OWNED BY MR M<sup>s</sup> R. SPICER.

FORMERLY M<sup>r</sup> M<sup>s</sup> DABSON. NEAREST THE DRIVEWAY WAS MR M<sup>s</sup> AMES. OPPOSITE ~~THE~~ BROOK PLACE A FOOTPATH LED DOWN TO THE RIVER OVER THE BRIDGE UP TO THE CHURCH. THE CHURCH OF ALL SAINTS IS OF STONE IN THE EARLY ENGLISH STYLE IT WAS REBUILT IN 1841 AND 1878. IT HAS A BELL COTE CONTAINING 1 BELL AND SEVERAL MEMORIAL WINDOWS THE CHURCH AFFORDS 120 SITTINGS. THE REGISTER DATES FROM THE YEAR 15~~4~~ 1556. THE LIVING IS A RECTORY, WITH RESIDENCE AND 10 ACRES OF GLEBE WITH THE VICARAGE OF POSTLING ANNEXED, JOINT NET YEARLY VALUE £491. IN THE GIFT OF THE ARCHBISHOP

OF CANTERBURY, TWO TURNS AND MRS TYLDEN GIVE TURN, THE RECTORY BEING HELD SINCE 1899, AND THE COMBINED LIVINGS SINCE 1902 BY THE REV<sup>d</sup> HERBERT FRANCIS SMITH MA OF PEMBROKE ~~COLLEGE~~ COLLEGE CAMBRIDGE. A ~~CELTIC CROSS OF GRANITE WAS ERECTED IN 1920~~

BEHIND THE CHURCH TO THE EAST WAS THE RECTORY AND TO THE LEFT WAS THE VERGERS COTTAGE, AND ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF THE CHURCH WAS THE VILLAGE SCHOOL. THE HEADMISTRESS WAS MISS BLACKWELL, AND PUPILS CAME OVER FROM POSTLING TO ATTEND. THE ROAD LED DOWN FROM THE SCHOOL THROUGH THE FORD. (RIVER STOUR) TO THE STONE STREET ROAD. ON THE LEFT WERE ALLOTMENTS AND TO THE RIGHT OF THE ROAD THE PARISH ROOM. IN FRONT OF WHICH STOOD A CELTIC CROSS OF GRANITE ERECTED IN 1920. AS A MEMORIAL TO THE MEN OF THE PARISH WHO FELL IN THE GREAT WAR 1914-18 THE COST WAS ABOUT £100 RAISED BY PUBLIC SUBSCRIPTIONS.

NEXT TO "BROOK PLACE", "TUDOR COTTAGE" THE HOME OF MISS BLACKWELL THE SCHOOL MISTRESS THEN HILL VIEW LIVED NURSE TWOSE AND HER SISTER.

C IS FOR CHILDHOOD AND CHANCES

As a child I moved to Stanford with my parents, brothers and sister from Lyme, in 1930, ~~we~~ we attended the local school, now a private residence, the school mistress at that time was Miss Blackwell. On one occasion I recall I was sent on an errand to her home "Tudor Cottage" to collect some school material. On my return I asked what were the things on the piano, ~~you~~ <sup>you</sup> were not supposed to have seen them she replied, but come Christmas all was revealed at the crib service, a gift for the church from Miss Blackwell a set of figurines, ~~there~~ <sup>there</sup> was Mary and Joseph with the baby Jesus, the three kings with their manservant, the shepherds with their sheep, the ox and the ass, and a camel looking in on the peaceful scene. And are still enjoyed by children at Christmas on this day over sixty years later. When I was a little <sup>older</sup> I joined the church choir, and at times helped Miss Bushnell the organist by pumping the bellows for her to practise, ready for the Sunday service, at which some of the older boys took turns. That was before electricity was laid on in 1936 the church was also lit by oil lamps before that and heated by a coal fired boiler.

How well I remember going to one of the village stores next to the forge, owned by Miss Hills and her companion Miss Bowles, to fetch paraffin and candles, <sup>etc</sup> for my mother, not forgetting my sweets for going. One day my sister came running indoors, Mum Mum. She called they are lowering Miss Bowles down a plank from the bedroom window in her coffin, not an unusual thing at that time, but quite dramatic for a young girl.

Further up the road where the Drum car park is now, stood a large brick building where the licensed Mr Percival used to repair bicycles as a side line, much in demand at that time as the number of cars in Stanford ~~at that time~~ could be counted on one hand. Unfortunately he had to give up the repairs owing to a shooting accident, his gun went off and shot him in the arm as he was getting over ~~as~~ a stile. ~~and~~ his arm had to be taken off.

At the last house past the Drum, Mount Pleasant Mr Golding had a dairy farm. where we used to go and fetch our milk. It was a common sight to see the cows going ~~home~~ <sup>home</sup> to be milked. At the opposite end of the village was Fairmead Farm another dairy farm. They used to deliver milk, a young man walked round the village with a yoke <sup>round</sup> ~~on~~ his shoulders with two pails and a measure. Opposite Yew Tree Cottages Mr Golding had stables and two cart horses, on which we were allowed to ride home on after their work in the fields. Next to the stables was a large barn and the district nurse's garage. Nurse Twose lived at Hillview. We also had a village postman Mr Cobb senior <sup>who</sup> used to cycle to and fro from Sellindge Post Office with the mail. Opposite Mr Spicers there were two cottages Woodbine and Rosemary (no longer there) and a small white gate called "Spot Hedge Gate" leading past the allotments on the right and over the bridge up to the church.

The river was a great attraction to us children with musk, forget-me-nots, meadow, sweet, and lovely water cress growing in it, in hot weather it was great fun to paddle in the loch stream. Beyond that was a ~~big~~ playing field ~~for~~ <sup>where</sup> we use to play cricket and football with the boys, mainly in the outfield I might add. To collect the ball, they seemed to forget or with intent that sometimes we were supposed to bat. At the lower end of the field was a sharp drop down into what we called the dell. It was great fun to slide down the bank and tobogganing in the winter, years later the dell was filled in. At the top end there ~~was~~ <sup>was</sup> a footpath where in fine weather the children from Postling ~~came~~ <sup>walked</sup> over to school. The rector Mr Smith took the same route from Stanford to Postling every Sunday to take the services. The children from Gibbons Brook also ~~came~~ <sup>walked</sup> over to school. On the same side of the road as the allotments was the parish room, where one of the annual events was the flower and vegetable shows where with friendly rivalry between the gardeners they showed off their best exhibits. There was a real community spirit where everybody <sup>knew</sup> ~~everybody~~ everybody all went to make for a happy village. Other activities were dances, ~~which~~ <sup>known</sup> as the sixpenny hops, whist drives, etc, also used by the Royal British Legion.

The church was the heart of village life. and the Reverend Francis Smith was the rector for Stanford with Postling for over fifty years. Sadly the heart doesn't beat so strongly now.
